# **Chairman's Report**

The region has had a relatively quiet 2013 compared to previous years where the numbers of incidents were rising at a worrying rate. The tables at the end of this report prepared by our statistics officer are supported by notes to help make sense of the changes from previous years. The good summer weather appears to have made a positive contribution to this static figure although the severe winter weather at the beginning of 2013 caught many people out who were inadequately prepared or equipped for full winter conditions. Education and awareness of the dangers and risks for the ill prepared remains a prime concern for teams and hopefully in time the message will get across. I make no apology for repeating this mantra every year if it helps save a single life.

A question often asked is "when is the busiest time for rescues?" There is no standard answer although it should come as no surprise to find the week following the clocks going back in the autumn remains a busy period with walkers ill prepared for the onset of darkness and becoming benighted on the mountain. Some things will never change. However, putting these annual frustration to one side, there have been some significant changes in 2013.

It is over twelve months since we completed the RESCUE 2020 strategic review of mountain rescue in the Lakes. All our teams have risen to the challenges identified within the final report and progress has been made in all areas, especially at team level with respect to team collaboration, managing the increasing workload and recruitment of new members. The key challenge for the region as a whole was the urgent need to improve working with our partner organisations to ensure a much speedier deployment of our teams. New technology developed by mountain rescue in North Wales (SARCALL) has assisted tremendously in this area. The system is fully implemented and fully used throughout the region and more importantly, actively taken on board by Cumbria Police and the North West Ambulance Service. It has transformed the way teams are called out and has reduced delays in calling us out. It has improved internal communication between the teams and also with our external partner agencies. There has also been a step change in understanding the differences and the needs of mountain rescue and far greater co-operation on the ground.

As a region we remain very proud and privileged to be able to provide our voluntary rescue service. This is only possible through the generosity of those we rescue and the people visiting or living within our communities. There is very little in the way of central funding; therefore fundraising remains an ongoing and very important task for the teams with annual costs running at between £30,000 and £80,000 per team and rising. Donations, bequests and legacies, which are sent to the Association, do make a significant difference. It is gratifying to see that the work of the teams is recognised by both those we rescue and the general public who hear about the work we do. Income to the Association is shared equally amongst the twelve teams to supplement their own fundraising activities. It is important that those who donate know and understand that their contributions,

however small, do make a big difference to the ability of teams to provide our free rescue service to the Cumbrian communities and to visitors in the area.

In conclusion, I would like to thank our many supporters, without your help and donations we could not exist as a volunteer service. I would also like to thank those organisations and agencies with whom we work, the 450 volunteer team members of LDSAMRA and their families for their limitless commitment and support and the LDSAMRA officers, working groups and sub-committees for their dedication, support and hard work over the past twelve months.

- 1. There is some small comfort that the figures have not increased to any significant degree. Visitor levels have not appeared to change the figures in any way. The good summer weather appears to have made a positive contribution to this static picture.
- 2. Without accurate participation figures, it is difficult to explain the steady decrease in climbing and scrambling incidents. These figures seem to be hiding a serious issue. There seems to be fewer climbing incidents but the usual scrambling black spots, still seem to be very busy. Blencathra has again contributed 3 incidents. However, Jack's Rake, Pavey Ark has only appeared once this year. Unlike last year when fatalities were quite common.
- 3. Mountain biking incident are now on a similar scale to those of rock sports. The national figures for the year show a marked increase over the same period 5 years ago. It is hoped that the raising of awareness through specialist media will contribute to a reduction.
- 4. Whilst these figures are quite low, the figures for fell running should be watched with interest. It is hoped that this time next year, these figures will reduce to something much lower.

- 1. The number of persons requiring assistance in the region again shows an encouraging drop.
- 2. Nearly half of the persons involving in non-winter hill walking and in need of assistance, did so because they had not made adequate preparations. This aspect has been a common feature of these annual reports for many years. There seems to be an attitude that walking the fell is a natural activity. The truth is much different. Walking skills, stamina, danger-awareness and navigation have to be fostered. This can only be done by training and experience
- 3. The previous comment is reinforced by consideration of hill walking in winter conditions. The severe weather at the end of the winter caught many people out. Participant must acquire the necessary skill before they venture far on to the fells in winter conditions. Even the experience can sometimes get caught out.
- 4. Refer to the comment in note 2 on the previous table. Blencathra is a magnificent fell; the ascents are many and varied. However, Sharp Edge never fails to catch out the poorly prepared or reckless. Weather conditions can quickly change making the traverse of this exposed ridge a much harder scramble that first envisaged.

- 1. The decrease in total fatalities must be seen as heartening. There seems no apparent, underlying reason for this decrease.
- 2. While this figure shows a decrease in absolute terms, the fatality rate among non-winter hill walkers remains fairly constant at about 1 in 40. (This note remains exactly the same as last year!)
- 3. Rock scrambling is enjoyed by many people. However the consequences of a mistake or error of judgement is usually life-changing. Likewise the dividing line between one person mishap and another person's valuable lesson is very fine. Everyone is looking forward to an accident-free year on the Lake District's scrambling black spots.
- 4. This is the third year in succession that a mountain bike fatality has been recorded. This was recorded very close to a similar incident last year. Participants have to be made aware of some of the dangers; it is to be hoped that the specialist media help in this matter.
- 5. Drownings in the lakes and waters on Cumbria seem to be a constant theme of these notes. This time it appears lack of awareness of local conditions and weather forecasts have again not been heeded.

- 1. While this figure for those persons assisted required medical attention looks stable, it represents a rate of 49%. Given the rates for the other years shown are all lower relatively more people are in need of medical care than in previous years.
- 2. Again this unusually large increase is down to the significant wintry weather that swept the county in Feb/Mar.

- The increase/decrease in these two related categories needs explanation.
   The ankle is a joint (in fact it is three joints); it is common to attribute fractures to bones close to this joint as a fractured ankle. Whereas the fracture could be in a bone close to the joint i.e. in the lower leg (tibia and or fibula).
- 2. Recurrent knee injuries are quite common. They are often self-managed by the patient. However, prolonged activity will make recovery into a lengthy process. For this reason, many sufferers are glad of assistance.

# **Mobile Phones & Mountain Rescue**

# **Advice to Users**

There is no doubt that using mobile phones have saved lives in the mountains and fells of this country. The sooner rescue teams are alerted to an incident, the better are the chances of a quick and complete recovery for the victim. However, over the past few years there have been occasions when teams have been alerted inappropriately. The notes that follow are given in the hope that the mobile phone can be used to better effect and to minimise any frustration.

# When to use

- If you or a member of your party sustains an injury warranting the assistance of a mountain rescue team.
- If you come across someone who has sustained an injury warranting the assistance of a mountain rescue team.
- If one of the party has become separated from you and you have made every effort to but have been unable to meet up again.
- If you want to report having seen or heard any internationally recognised distress calls.
- If you wish to notify someone of a change of plan (not a 999 call).

# When not to use

- Do not use the mobile phone at the 'first sign of trouble'; be self-reliant if possible.
- Do not rely solely on the mobile phone as a safety device; there are areas of poor or not reception ('dead areas').
- The mobile phone is not a substitute for experience.

# How to use

1. First make a note of all relevant details, Location and Grid Reference Name, Gender and Age of Casualty.

Nature of Injuries or disability.

Number of people in party and intended destination.

THE NUMBER OF THE MOBILE PHONE IN USE.

- 2. Dial 999 and ask for the Police.
- 3. Make sure you tell the operator that you require the Cumbria Police as you are in the Cumbria.
- 4. When connected to a Police control room, check that it is the Cumbria Police. If it is not, then make sure that the information will be passed on.
- 5. Explain the nature of your call, giving details previously prepared (1).
- 6. Do NOT change your position until contacted by Rescue Team, who will agree future protocol for use of Phone.
- 7. If you have to make a further 999 call, use ALL the procedure again.

# **Advice to Mountain Users**

Many calls to Mountain Rescue Teams are avoidable. With adequate preparation, awareness of local conditions, experience and the application of commonsense, the number of accidents can be reduced. The following points cover the minimum precautions you should take if you want to avoid getting hurt or lost or, in the event of an accident, minimise further harm to you and your party.

# **Planning and Preparation**

- Plan before setting out! Maps are essential and guidebooks are full of advice.
- Consider the equipment, experience, capabilities and enthusiasm of the party members.
- Check the weather forecast and local conditions; Scottish mountains can be major undertakings. Night encroaches early in the winter and the further north you go! Check the website www.mwis.org.uk
- Carry a First Aid kit and learn how to give First Aid.
- Many accidents occur towards the latter part of the day when both your energy levels and those of your phone and GPS batteries will be run down. Did you remember to charge your battery before setting out?

# **Footwear and Clothing**

- Wear suitable boots with a treaded sole and sufficient support for ankles.
- Clothing should be colourful, warm, windproof and waterproof.
- Take spare warm clothing and perhaps a hat and gloves; it is always colder on the tops.

# **Food and Drink**

- In addition to the usual sandwiches, take chocolate, dates, or similar sweet things, this can restore energy quickly. You may not need them yourself, but someone else may.
- Streams on hills are drinkable if fast-running over stony beds.

# **Equipment and its Use**

- A map, compass and the ability to use them; at least one reliable watch in the party should always be carried.
- If you carry a GPS, at least know how to read your current position. It could save a lot of hassle in an emergency when speaking to the Mountain Rescue Team.
- In all conditions, it is wise to carry a whistle, torch, spare batteries and bulbs; but in winter conditions, an ice-axe, crampons and survival bag are essential.
- Climbers and mountain bikers are all urged to wear suitable helmets at all times.

# **Party Size**

- If in groups, make sure party leaders are experienced; do not let the party become separated.
- Take special care of the youngest and weakest in dangerous places.
- If you prefer to go alone, be aware of the additional risk. Let people know your route before you start, stick to it as far as you can and notify them of any changes.

# **Emergency Procedures**

- Be prepared to turn back if conditions are against you; even if this upsets your plan. Report changes of route or timetable to someone who is expecting you.
- If you have a serious problem, get a message to the Police (999) for help as soon as possible and keep injured/exhausted people safe and warm until help reaches you. If you cannot contact anyone, use six whistle blasts or torch flashes, repeated at minute intervals, to signal an emergency.

# Dangers - all can be avoided by good route-finding

- · Cliffs, slopes of ice or steep snow
- · Very steep grass slopes, especially if frozen or wet
- Unstable boulders, gullies, gorges and stream beds
- Rivers and streams in spate
- Snow cornices on ridges or gully tops
- · Exceeding your experience and abilities

# Dangers – all can be avoided by remaining alert

- Weather changes these can be sudden and more extreme than forecast
- Ice on path carry an ice-axe and crampons and know how to use them
- · Loss of concentration, especially toward the end of a long day
- · Excessive cold or heat dress appropriately
- Separating from the rest of the group
- Incipient exhaustion know the signs; rest, take some food and keep warm
- Accident or illness don't panic if you send for help, make sure you stay put and the rescuers know exactly where to come
- Passage of Time especially true when under pressure allow extra time in winter conditions

# **Pride**

 It is no disgrace to turn back if you are not certain. A party must be governed by the capabilities of the weakest member.

# **Donating To Mountain Rescue**

If you wish to support financially the Mountain Rescue Service, in the Lake District, the Association will be pleased to receive your donation. The Association equally shares out all it receives to the 12 Teams in the Lake District. There are several ways of assisting, some more financially advantageous than others.

#### 1. Gift Aid

Following recent changes in the law relating to donating to charities, completion of a Deed of Covenant is no longer necessary. Most donations are now covered by a Gift Aid declaration. If you pay tax, Gift Aid is a scheme by which you can give a sum of money to a charity and the charity can reclaim from the Inland Revenue basic rate tax on your gift. You can make payments by cash, cheque, postal order, direct debit or standing order. Subject to a few rules, you can give any amount, large or small, regular or one-off and the charity can reclaim the tax.

If you want to make a donation through Gift Aid please complete the form printed overleaf having read the notes and return it, with either your donation or a completed copy of the Bankers Order to the Association's treasurer.

- 1.1 If your declaration covers donations you may make in the future:
  - Please notify the charity if you change your name or address while the declaration is in force
  - You can cancel the declaration at any time by notifying the charity it will then not apply to donations you make on or after the date of the cancellation or such later date as you specify.
- 1.2 You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that the charity reclaims on your donations in the tax year (currently 28p for each pound you give).
- 1.3 If in future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax that the charity reclaims, you can cancel your declaration (see note 1.1)
- 1.4 If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your Self Assessment tax return.
- 1.5 If you are unsure whether your donations qualify for Gift Aid tax relief, ask the charity. Or you can ask your local tax office for leaflet IR113 *Gift Aid*

#### 2. Give As You Earn

This is a tax free way of giving to charities direct from your pay and many employers have agreed to co-operate. The donation is deducted from your pay before your tax deduction is calculated.
