

### **Chairman's Report**

In my introduction to last year's annual report I expressed serious concern about the 13% increase in incidents (compared to 2009) returning just under 600 incidents. With incidents showing a 50% increase over a five-year period we were asking ourselves some serious questions about the growing trend, the numbers of avoidable incidents (particularly searches for lost walkers) and when would it all end.

2011 brought some respite with numbers significantly down. 424 individual incidents were dealt with by the Lake District teams. This represents a remarkable 29% decrease that can only be partially explained by the previous years' very high figures. It is possible that a fall in visitor numbers in the area and a different type of person coming to the area appears the likeliest explanation. Perhaps more of the people venturing onto the fells have improved their experience or knowledge. Better weather may also have contributed to the improvement. There appears to be a raft of possible causes. We might hope that one possible reason is down to the numerous public awareness initiatives that have been rolled out over the past four years. LDSAMRA in conjunction with Cicerone promoted the 'How to Stay Safe and Enjoy the Fells' leaflet. The leaflet can be found and printed from the LDSAMRA website (http://www.ldsamra.org.uk/). The aim is to help people make the right choices before going into the hills and provide information for what to do in the event of an accident and how to avoid getting lost or benighted. It is a very helpful addition to anyone's rucksack when heading into the fells.

The reduction in the number of fatalities (43%) is welcome news but it only takes a small number to change this percentage. It is clearly linked to the overall drop in incidents which in turn is linked to visitor numbers and weather. The level of danger also plays a part in determining fatality rates. The incident officer rightly raises concerns about the deaths occurring in water-related activities. 50% of the people requiring assistance were fatalities. This is a very sobering statistics and should alert participants to the need for proper training and supervision; equally, local knowledge should temper any ambitious plans in view of the behaviour of local winds and lake temperatures.

We remain very proud and privileged to be able to provide our voluntary rescue service. This is only possible through the generosity of those we rescue and people visiting or living within our communities. There is very little in the way of central funding; therefore fundraising remains an ongoing and very important task for the teams with annual costs running at between £30,000 and £75,000 per team and rising. Donations, bequests and legacies, which are sent into the Association, do make a significant difference. It is gratifying to see that the work of the teams is recognised by both those we rescue and the general public who hear about the work we do. Income to the association is shared equally amongst the twelve teams to supplement their own fundraising activities. It is important that those who donate know and understand that their contributions, however small, do make a difference to the ability of teams to provide our free rescue service to the Cumbrian communities and to visitors in the area.

To conclude my report, I would like to thank the organisations and agencies with which we work and also thank the LDSAMRA officers and working groups for their dedication, support and hard work over the past twelve months, which, although rescue numbers were down, has been another, busy year for our twelve teams.

- 1. The decrease of 29% is very dramatic and can only be partially explained by the previous years' high figures. The explanation appears to result from a fall in visitor numbers in the area and a different type of person coming to the area. It is possible that more of the people venturing onto the fells have greater experience or knowledge. At the same time, the weather has been particularly favourable. There appears to be a raft of possible causes.
- 2. This significant decrease must be explained by the less severe wintry weather experienced at the start and end of 2011.
- 3. There are two contributors to this figure's decrease; on the one hand, the less severe weather (above) and visitor number reductions.
- 4. It is very strange that the previous two years Mountain Biking incident figures have suddenly increased (160%) this may be explained by firstly increased popularity in participation and secondly by the growth in facilities within the area; a number of new mountain bike trails have become well-established and popular.
- 5. Resilience (previously referred to as Local Incidents) are directly related to weather conditions; so this reduction is not unexpected

- 1. While the drop in persons requiring assistance has decreased by 26% appears significant, this figure has not matched the drop in incident figures on the previous page. This warrants further comment (see later).
- 2. This decrease is only 8%, clearly this has not kept in step with the incident figures (see Table 1). See also the comment on Table 4; there would appear to be an increasing number of people requiring help who are not injured; that is, they are lost, missing or Cragfast. These reasons are a measure of poor preparation, inadequate experience and / or poor training in essential skills.
- 3. The dramatic reduction is easily explained by the less severe wintry weather experienced in the first few months of 2011, by comparison the previous years.
- 4. The increase in people involved in Mountain Biking requiring the services of MR should be noted; perhaps providers of mountain bike trails should monitor their use and consider changes should problems be identified. Are such providers aware when incidents take place on their trails?

- 1. The reduction in the number of fatalities (43%) is very encouraging but it only takes a small number to change this percentage. It is clearly linked to the overall drop in incidents which in turn is linked to visitor numbers and weather. The level of danger also plays a part in determining fatality rates (see later)
- 2. The decrease in fatalities for hill walking exceeds the decrease in hill walking incidents. Weather conditions and personal level of fitness all play a part but this is not cause for complacency.
- 3. As if the highlight the already noted increase in mountain bike related activity, this is only the second recorded death in the area (the previous on was in 2004). Participants do not need reminding of the consequences of a mishap and must make the necessary preparations including personal protection and experience.
- 4. Of particular concern are the deaths occurring in water-related activities. 50% of the people requiring assistance were fatalities. This is a very sobering statistics and should alert participants to the need for proper training and supervision; equally, local knowledge should temper any ambitious plans in view of the behaviour of local winds and lake temperatures.

- 1. The decrease in person requiring medical attention is consistent with the decrease in incident figures (30%).
- 2. However, the decrease (21%) in this category involved in hill walking is not consistent with persons requiring assistance decreases figure of 9%. The meaning is the number of persons uninjured has increased from 199 in 2010 to 222 in 2011, one of the very few figures that show an increase. This can only be explained by more people requiring help after becoming lost, reported missing or cragfast. All these can be reduced by adequate preparation and increased experience and training
- 3. This increase is consistent with the other increases noted in mountain biking.
- 4. Once again, this figure is deceptive; while it looks good that no-one required medical attention, 50% were fatalities.

# **Causes of Incidents**

The following table is the result of a search through all the reports for key words relating to the causes of calling out the MRTs. For example, the category 'Benighted' will include any word with 'benight-' and 'darkness' as part of the word or phrase.

Please note that the totals of these columns may not match the number of incidents given at the bottom of each column. Many incident reports refer to more than one of these causes. A typical report will illustrate this:-

'tripped on footpath whilst walking and fell 2m onto rocky ground' This will result in contributions to the 'Slip, Trip or Stumble' and 'Fall or Tumble' categories.

#### Notes:

1. A third (34%) of these incidents can best be described as 'avoidable'. Becoming cragfast, benighted, lost or disorientated, reported overdue or missing can all be avoided. The recurring theme each year is the same, these incidents can be avoided if only due regard had been paid to training and experience in matters of navigation and preparation.

- 1. The number of arm injuries may be explained by the increase in mountain bike incidents
- 2. The increased proportion of persons presenting with facial and head injuries is a cause of concern; the use of helmets is strongly advocated and could possibly have reduced these figures.
- The same advice cannot be offered to explain the increased proportion of person suffering lower leg injuries. Many instances of this are attributed to lapses in concentration when crossing unfamiliar terrain; a momentary distraction has led to significant short term pain and possible longer term disability.

# **Mobile Phones & Mountain Rescue**

#### **Advice to Users**

There is no doubt that using mobile phones have saved lives in the mountains and fells of this country. The sooner rescue teams are alerted to an incident, the better are the chances of a quick and complete recovery for the victim. However, over the past few years there have been occasions when teams have been alerted inappropriately. The notes that follow are given in the hope that the mobile phone can be used to better effect and to minimise any frustration.

#### When to use

- If you or a member of your party sustains an injury warranting the assistance of a mountain rescue team.
- If you come across someone who has sustained an injury warranting the assistance of a mountain rescue team.
- If one of the party has become separated from you and you have made every effort to but have been unable to meet up again.
- If you want to report having seen or heard any internationally recognised distress calls.
- If you wish to notify someone of a change of plan (not a 999 call).

# When not to use

- Do not use the mobile phone at the 'first sign of trouble'; be self-reliant if possible.
- Do not rely solely on the mobile phone as a safety device; there are areas of poor or not reception ('dead areas').
- The mobile phone is not a substitute for experience.

# How to use

1. First make a note of all relevant details, Location and Grid Reference Name, Gender and Age of Casualty.

Nature of Injuries or disability.

Number of people in party and intended destination.

THE NUMBER OF THE MOBILE PHONE IN USE.

- 2. Dial 999 and ask for the Police.
- 3. Make sure you tell the operator that you require the Cumbria Police as you are in the Cumbria.
- 4. When connected to a Police control room, check that it is the Cumbria Police. If it is not, then make sure that the information will be passed on.
- 5. Explain the nature of your call, giving details previously prepared (1).
- 6. Do NOT change your position until contacted by Rescue Team, who will agree future protocol for use of Phone.
- 7. If you have to make a further 999 call, use ALL the procedure again.

# **Advice to Mountain Users**

Many calls to Mountain Rescue Teams are avoidable. With adequate preparation, awareness of local conditions, experience and the application of commonsense, the number of accidents can be reduced. The following points cover the minimum precautions you should take if you want to avoid getting hurt or lost or, in the event of an accident, minimise further harm to you and your party.

# **Planning and Preparation**

- Plan before setting out! Maps are essential and guidebooks are full of advice.
- Consider the equipment, experience, capabilities and enthusiasm of the party members.
- Check the weather forecast and local conditions; Scottish mountains can be major undertakings. Night encroaches early in the winter and the further north you go! Check the website www.mwis.org.uk
- · Carry a First Aid kit and learn how to give First Aid.
- Many accidents occur towards the latter part of the day when both your energy levels and those of your phone and GPS batteries will be run down. Did you remember to charge your battery before setting out?

# **Footwear and Clothing**

- Wear suitable boots with a treaded sole and sufficient support for ankles.
- Clothing should be colourful, warm, windproof and waterproof.
- Take spare warm clothing and perhaps a hat and gloves; it is always colder on the tops.

# **Food and Drink**

- In addition to the usual sandwiches, take chocolate, dates, or similar sweet things, this can restore energy quickly. You may not need them yourself, but someone else may.
- Streams on hills are drinkable if fast-running over stony beds.

# **Equipment and its Use**

- A map, compass and the ability to use them; at least one reliable watch in the party should always be carried.
- If you carry a GPS, at least know how to read your current position. It could save a lot of hassle in an emergency when speaking to the Mountain Rescue Team.
- In all conditions, it is wise to carry a whistle, torch, spare batteries and bulbs; but in winter conditions, an ice-axe, crampons and survival bag are essential.
- Climbers and mountain bikers are all urged to wear suitable helmets at all times.

# **Party Size**

- If in groups, make sure party leaders are experienced; do not let the party become separated.
- Take special care of the youngest and weakest in dangerous places.
- If you prefer to go alone, be aware of the additional risk. Let people know your route before you start, stick to it as far as you can and notify them of any changes.

# **Emergency Procedures**

- Be prepared to turn back if conditions are against you; even if this upsets your plan. Report changes of route or timetable to someone who is expecting you.
- If you have a serious problem, get a message to the Police (999) for help as soon as possible and keep injured/exhausted people safe and warm until help reaches you. If you cannot contact anyone, use six whistle blasts or torch flashes, repeated at minute intervals, to signal an emergency.

# Dangers - all can be avoided by good route-finding

- · Cliffs, slopes of ice or steep snow
- · Very steep grass slopes, especially if frozen or wet
- Unstable boulders, gullies, gorges and stream beds
- Rivers and streams in spate
- Snow cornices on ridges or gully tops
- · Exceeding your experience and abilities

# Dangers – all can be avoided by remaining alert

- Weather changes these can be sudden and more extreme than forecast
- Ice on path carry an ice-axe and crampons and know how to use them
- · Loss of concentration, especially toward the end of a long day
- Excessive cold or heat dress appropriately
- Separating from the rest of the group
- Incipient exhaustion know the signs; rest, take some food and keep warm
- Accident or illness don't panic if you send for help, make sure you stay put and the rescuers know exactly where to come
- Passage of Time especially true when under pressure allow extra time in winter conditions

# **Pride**

 It is no disgrace to turn back if you are not certain. A party must be governed by the capabilities of the weakest member.

# **Donating To Mountain Rescue**

If you wish to support financially the Mountain Rescue Service, in the Lake District, the Association will be pleased to receive your donation. The Association equally shares out all it receives to the 13 Teams in the Lake District. There are several ways of assisting, some more financially advantageous than others.

#### 1. Gift Aid

Following recent changes in the law relating to donating to charities, completion of a Deed of Covenant is no longer necessary. Most donations are now covered by a Gift Aid declaration. If you pay tax, Gift Aid is a scheme by which you can give a sum of money to a charity and the charity can reclaim from the Inland Revenue basic rate tax on your gift. You can make payments by cash, cheque, postal order, direct debit or standing order. Subject to a few rules, you can give any amount, large or small, regular or one-off and the charity can reclaim the tax.

If you want to make a donation through Gift Aid please complete the form printed overleaf having read the notes and return it, with either your donation or a completed copy of the Bankers Order to the Association's treasurer.

- 1.1 If your declaration covers donations you may make in the future:
  - Please notify the charity if you change your name or address while the declaration is in force
  - You can cancel the declaration at any time by notifying the charity it will then not
    apply to donations you make on or after the date of the cancellation or such later
    date as you specify.
- 1.2 You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that the charity reclaims on your donations in the tax year (currently 28p for each pound you give).
- 1.3 If in future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax that the charity reclaims, you can cancel your declaration (see note 1.1)
- 1.4 If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your Self Assessment tax return.
- 1.5 If you are unsure whether your donations qualify for Gift Aid tax relief, ask the charity. Or you can ask your local tax office for leaflet IR113 Gift Aid

# 2. Give As You Earn

This is a tax free way of giving to charities direct from your pay and many employers have agreed to co-operate. The donation is deducted from your pay before your tax deduction is calculated.
